On behalf of Playford College Board of directors I am pleased to present the annual report for the academic year of 2021. It is without question that school staff and student faced the many challenges related to COVID 19. The daily follow up of the public health reports required major and quick adaptations to the teaching and learning frameworks throughout the entire school to allow students to have an effective and smooth transition to online learning without compromising on the quality of education.

As a community that is rooted in the Islamic tradition, Playford College aim to contribute to our local and wider communities, providing experiences that nurture holistic development considering the spiritual, psychological, and physical dimensions of our existence.

Over this twelve-month period, the board worked hard to achieve its goals and support the school and I am delighted for the achievement & success that the Board has accomplished. Despite the many challenges, the School Board continued in its steady governance and policy role, working with, and supporting School Leadership as required.

#### Governance

The commitment of being on the School Board is significant, with monthly Board and Finance Committee meetings along with the preparation time required for each meeting. It is a role that none of the Board Directors take lightly, and I am thankful for the thoughtful and robust contributions from each of the Board Directors.

Playford College Board worked closely with School Leadership to ensure the school achieves excellence in academic outcomes and provides quality educations while ensuing this occurs within an Islamic faith, manners, and values. We also worked with School Leadership to introduce several policies, Standards and guidelines that promote above principles and encourage our staff and students to take the best of their opportunities and focus their efforts to make themselves proud of their faith and culture.

The Board thanks the very significant work of both our School Leadership and Finance Manager for their diligence and hard work in achieving healthy financed and budget. Based on our 5-year cashflow projections, the Board is confident, that our borrowings are within our current and projected capacity.

#### **Changes in Board of Directors**

In Mid 2022, **Dr Saad Jaber** decided to resign from his role as Board Director due to personal reasons. On behalf of school board, I would like to thank Dr Jaber for his sincere help and valuable contributions to school project since 2015 and Playford college school board from 2016 until now.

Dr Jaber role in establishing Playford College won't be forgotten, and he will continue to be one of Playford College pillars and main founder. We hope that Dr Jaber won't be away from school board



for long time and will join us again when his time allows him to contribute effectively to various school board activities.

The Board appointed **Mr. Salih Al Rashid** as a board director to replace Dr Jaber. Mr Al Rashid was a volunteer at Playford College from its inception in 2016 as IT Committee member and continued his role recently when the school requested his skills and experience in IT Audit and IT Officer selection, interview, and employment.

### Strategic and Master Plan

The year 2021 was also highlighted by 2 main events at Playford College. First, Playford College continued to grow in many areas and develop in several dimensions, including student enrolments and the increasing waiting list. This reflects parents and students' confidence in the school and its bright future. This increased enrolment promoted School Leadership and school board to upgrade and develop school facilities. The second one is the completion of several projects and buildings refurbishment that are aimed to provide excellent learning environment.

In 2021, the College Board met frequently with School Leadership to oversee many projects that were completed in our school as listed in the table below.

School board and school leadership worked with school Architects, PPA and school Planner in the planning and preparation for stage 3 and 4 of our Master Plans. This project will provide state of the art multi-stage building to provide multi-million-dollar project will include double storey, state of-the-art, custom designed buildings. The key focus of the project is to enhance teaching and learning to promote better educational results in the community.

The ground floor will have 3 laboratories (Art Lab, ICT and Design Technology) and brand-new toilets for boys and girls while the upper floor has and 6 GLA and new staff room.
